



The Department of English at Forman Christian College (A Chartered University) organized its second international conference on the theme of "Inter-Dis-Connections of the Prefix 'Post' in Contemporary Literary, Linguistic, and Cultural Studies" on the 19th and 20th of October, 2022.

Conference Day 1

The introductory session began with a recitation from the holy scripts. The conference was opened by the worthy Vice Rector and the Patron -in -Chief of the conference Dr. Douglas Trimble. In his Welcome Remarks, Dr. Trimble discussed the significance of the conference theme i.e. the concept of 'post' in academic circles and beyond. He also talked about the post-pandemic period and expressed sheer delight in being able to see one another in person. Then, the Chairperson of the Department of English Language and Literature, Prof. Dr. Fatima Syeda, on behalf of the department, expressed her gratitude to the national and international speakers, presenters, faculty members, and students for becoming part of the academic conference.

She talked about how the debate on the prefix 'Post' had been conducted within the department and how this conference was a humble effort on the part of the department to extend this debate to the other universities. She thanked different universities for their participation in this debate. A video was played showcasing the literary and scholarly activities and other achievements made by the Department of English.

The keynote speakers of the first day were Professor Stef Craps from Ghent University, Belgium, and Dr. Cathy Caruth from Cornell University, USA. Dr. Craps delivered his keynote speech on the topic "The Beforemath of Eco-Collapse: Post-memory and Futurity in the Anthropocene" in which he emphasized the looming climate destruction and an ecological





apocalypse for mankind in the foreseeable future. Dr. Caruth discussed the topic of "Orphaned Language: Trauma, History and Writing in David Copperfield" highlighting the themes of abandonment, traumatic childhood, and personal and collective tragedy. Both speeches were well received by the audience. The complete opening ceremony was recorded as well as played on

screens in E square for the students who could not come to the conference Hall because of space problems.

The introductory session, of the first day, was then followed by parallel sessions running throughout the day at four different time slots. The conference sessions of the first and the second day discussed themes including Post-Humanism in literature and films, Post Trauma theory, the impact of trauma on women, power politics and trauma, language and gender, indigenous resistance, migrant experiences, subjugation and discrimination in drama, post 9/11 literature, feminist concerns, and Post-Feminist Theory.

The parallel sessions of the first day ended with an evening of musical and artistic performances, hosted by the talented university students. One of the performers dedicated Punjabi poetry to the international guest speaker Professor Dr. Amritjit Singh receiving great appreciation from him. The evening included performances by the Forman Dramatics Club, Forman Music Society, and poetic recitation by Professor Dr. Ishfaq Virk (Urdu Department), and special performances by violinists invited for the evening which delighted the audience

Conference Day 2

Day II commenced with recitations from the Holy Books, followed by a video recap of the previous day. The first keynote address was presented virtually by Dr. Francesca Ferrando – Assistant Professor, Liberal Arts Program, New York University, USA, and a post-human theorist. The session was moderated by Dr. Quratulaen, the conference convener. Dr. Ferrando discussed the concept (of post-humanism) with reference to ecological changes. The faculty and the audience posed interesting questions to the speaker about the post-humanistic era and its implications in Pakistan. All the answers presented by Dr. Ferrando were clear, on-point, and easily understandable. She discussed the concept of existentialism and what it means to be a post-human. The session ended on a philosophical note, "What does it mean to be human in a post post Modern world?".

The Plenary speech was delivered by Prof. Dr. Nasir Jamal Khattak – Vice Chancellor, University of Swabi. Dr. Khattak, in his presentation "Recapitulating and Dialogizing Theory: "Kubla Khan", "El Olvido and "Latin Night at the Pawnshop", discussed post-humanism and post-colonialism. He discussed what the prefix 'post' referred to in the province of KPK since he is associated with Peshawar. He also brought along some Aristotelian laws in reference to post-humanism. He also highlighted some non-contemporary literature pieces from the 19th century, discussing artists' mindset and the gap between 'idea and materialism', how Aristotle has defined what a writer or artist should be, and how post-colonial writers and artists have boundaries to fit themselves into. The day II opening session came to an end with a thank you note and a group photo.

After the tea break, the paper presentations resumed, with the first slot of parallel sessions focusing on 1) human, post-human, and non-human alterities, 2) post-truth trajectories, 3) fantasy, science fiction, virtual reality studies: emerging post-human paradigm shifts in South Asia, and 4) the prefix 'post' in linguistics inquiry. Each of these sessions ended with the respective chairs' remarks and certificate distribution.

Next, the attendees headed to the E Square for viewing the poster presentations on modern and continental drama prepared by the postgraduate students. Afterward, a lunch break was announced. The second set of parallel sessions was centered on the themes of 1) post-anthropocentric trajectories: eco-criticism and literature, 2) language, learning, and culture, and 3) content analysis in linguistics. Each of these sessions ended with the respective chairs' remarks and certificate distribution. This marked the end of the paper presentations.

To add a literary touch along with scholarly learning, a performance by the playwright Mr. Usman Ali (Shah Jahan) was arranged for the audience. Mr. Usman Ali is an internationally recognized English playwright who is an actor also. He has performed internationally. All six characters in his play were performed by him on stage in his Solo performance. The students and Faculty members from different universities were excited to see this performance where a playwright himself was performing his play.



The conference officially ended with a closing ceremony where Dr. Amrijit Singh delivered the closing note. His talk covered multiple answers to the question posed on the reliability of the prefix 'post', and whether one can afford to postpone that debate or not. This soon turned into



an interactive discussion between the speaker and the conference participants that included students as well.

Next, a video recap of the two days of the conference was played for the audience, followed by closing remarks by Dr. Altaf Ullah Khan – Dean of Humanities, FCCU, and also the Patron of the conference.

He discussed the conference theme with reference to the discipline of humanities in general. Then, Dr. Fatima Syeda - Professor and Chairperson, Department of English, FCCU, delivered a vote of thanks to the sponsors of the conference i.e. the ORIC Office, USEFP, the office of the Vice Rector and the office of the




Dean and all the guests, presenters, faculty and student volunteers who made the event a huge success. The ceremony ended with a souvenir and bouquet presentation by the Dean of Humanities Dr. Altaf Ullah Khan to all the guest speakers.

• His first Public Lecture was organized under the banner of our very popular Graduate Seminar




- Series. It was held on 25th October 2022. All the students and faculty members of the Literature Program participated. Relevant departments from other universities were also invited.

- He paid informal visits to interact with the faculty at LUMS and Government College University, Lahore.










Graduate Seminar Series:



























Collaborations with the Advising Office:






M.Phil Research:

2. **Three-day Peace Journalism Workshop** on Surviving the Social Media Onslaught: Mainstream Journalism, Peace, and Democracy in the Transitional Societies, organized by the faculty of humanities in collaboration with JMIC and OsloMet. The Faculty of Humanities, Forman Christian College University (FCCU), in collaboration with the Department of Journalism and Media Studies (JMIC), Oslo Metropolitan University (OsloMet) Norway, hosted a three-day workshop on "Peace Journalism" on the topic of "Surviving the social media onslaught: Mainstream journalism, peace, and democracy in the transitional societies."

The event included academics, students, and expert journalists, plus representatives from over 40 top-tier national and international universities attended the workshop. Anne Hege Simonsen, the head of the department of journalism and media studies at Oslomet, Muhammad Feyyaz, Khalid Khattak,

multimedia journalist and Founder at Data Stories, and many other notable personalities attended the workshop. The presenters discussed major differences between mainstream media and social media, trying to find various channels to tackle the unethical aspects of news dissemination via media, and how to promote peaceful journalism via these platforms. Dr, Altaf Ullah Khan, Dean of Humanities at FCCU and organizer of the event,



inaugurated the workshop addressing the ethics and practices of mainstream and social media happening in the world right now. He added, "You have to use the social media platform instead of being used by it". The importance of language was further elaborated by Dr. Firasat Jabeen where she highlighted the juxtaposition Urdu-English Press. Furthermore, the first day ended with a statistical briefing by Khalid Khattak on how to balance technology with social media advancements.



The second day opened up with a captivating Q/A session between the Dean of Humanities, Dr, Altaf Ullah Khan and renowned anchor Rifatullah Khan where they shed light on the topic of "Reporting in Crisis Regions: Experiences as a Journalist".

Discussing his life experiences, Rifatullah Khan addressed numerous factors that journalists face while reporting in conflict zones. While explaining his journey in conflict reporting; he addressed the growing differences between the tribal and foreign journalists along with their organizations and the vice-versa outcomes.

An interactive session was held by Prof. Anne Hege Simonsen, from Oslo University, in which she grouped the participants and held an interactive session on how to identify the true meanings behind images on media platforms.

Moreover, Dr. Savera Mujib Shami talked about the main aspects of social capital and how 'trust' plays an important factor under this discipline. While talking about social capital and social media, she stated multiple factors leading towards a polarized society and how interaction is an essential element in building stronger bonds and tolerance levels. The topic of war and its relation with journalism was also brought forward by Prof. Elisabeth Eide. The topic uncovered propaganda, and explained about revealing a different side of every story with multiple perspectives.



Furthermore, day 2 was concluded by Dr. Jatin Srivastava where he highlighted the importance of following certain jargons and ethics when it comes to media outlets in order to build and maintain peace in journalism.

The last day of the event followed a theme of technology and dealing with social bullying. Ms. Tahira Tariq; Visiting Faculty at the Greenwich University, Karachi, presented on "Online Harassment and Social Media". With her vast research and literature, the audience engaged very well in the discussion. Her emphasis was mainly on the relevance of raising awareness on online harassment. Then Dr. Adeel Ahmed Amir presented on "Conflict Resolution in the Digital Age". His energizing session focused upon various concepts that come under issues of the digital age, mainly the formation and spread of fake and biased news content.

This session was followed by a tea break, after which an online session was conducted. Ms. Britta Peterson, advisor at Gesellschaft für Internationale Zusammenarbeit (GiZ). Her presentation was focused upon "A New Structural Transformation of the Public Sphere. Habermas and the Challenges of Social Media." Ms. Britta's presentation aimed at the public sphere and the historical aspects of how the mass media has played a role in transformation.

From her vast research on challenges of social media, she highlighted "it is not easy to curtail social media". After lunch, the last session was conducted by Mr. Shiraz Hasnat, Bureau Chief, HUM News Network, presented on "Social Media is Dominating Mainstream Media in Agenda Setting".

His presentation mainly discussed various statistics including the bulletin performance of Pakistani media channels within the past year. His argument stated that "Political stability and instability affects the rise and fall in the ratings."

Following the session, Dr. Altaf appreciated and thanked the presence of each participant for attending the 3-day workshop on Peace and Journalism. Certificates were distributed by Dr. Douglas Trimble, Vice Rector of FCCU.

The Faculty of Humanities, Forman Christian College (A Chartered University), in collaboration with Journalism & Media International Center (JMIC), OsloMet – Oslo Metropolitan University, Norway, and the MediaClimate Network hosted a one–day workshop on Climate Journalism Education.

The workshop was held on 13th December 2022, with various academicians, postgraduate students, and journalists joining in from all over Pakistan and abroad. Dr.AltafUllah Khan, Dean of Humanitie s at FCCU inaugurated the workshop and gave a keynote speech in which he stated. "In



the current environment, students need to have basic knowledge of climate change and we plan to make this into a skill set for them by introducing a course climate journalism in journalism institutions in Pakistan."

The workshop was moderated by Mr. Syed M. Saqib Saleem, Assistant Professor, Department of Mass Communication, FCCU. The workshop recommended best practices along with sharing the course documents developed by different universities in Pakistan. International experts also shared their expertise which



gave a fair understanding of the global reach of the syllabi for climate journalism.

Prof. Elizabeth Eide, JMIC and CoDirector Media Climate Network and
Professor of Journalism gave an
introduction to the workshop and

welcomed all the speakers and participants. They both highlighted how climate journalism education in Pakistan is the need of the hour considering the major climate crisis situation in Pakistan.

The first speaker of the workshop was Ms. Farahnaz Zahidi Moazzam, the Pakistani Editor at The Third Pole. She called Environmental Journalism the next big thing in Pakistan. She said that The Third Pole specializes in doing value addition stories in climate journalism for a better understanding of an ordinary reader.

Ms Farahnaz was followed by Prof. Andreas Ytterstad, Professor at the Department of Journalism and Media Studies, OsloMet. He shared that while science journalism sets the base for climate change reporting, we also need to report on societal changes and how it is being affected by climate change. He was of the view that "Climate change is really just global warming which is causing havoc all over the world. The word climate change has been politicized." After his speech, he gave the floor to Mr. Mofizur Rahman, Professor University of Dhaka, Bangladesh, and a member of the Media Climate Network. Mr. Mofizur Rahman highlighted the need for climate journalism education all over the world and shared the course outline of the course on climate journalism that he is teaching.

Mr. Daud Khan, an award-winning multimedia journalist based in KPK, Pakistan, and a member of the Oxford Climate Journalism Network gave a presentation on visualizing climate change. He shared some tools and resources that could be used while doing climate coverage which included Digital Observatory for Protected Areas (DOPA), Global Forest Watch, and SkyTruth Flaring Map. The last speaker of the day was Mr. Syed M. Saqib Saleem, Assistant Professor Department of Mass Communication. He shared alternate learning pathways for



climate journalism in Pakistan and ideas for course content in Pakistan. He said, "For improving the quality of climate news coverage, journalism students need to be trained in the universities and be motivated for climate action."

Finally, a group activity was done where participants brainstormed student learning objectives and course activities and presented their ideas on teaching climate journalism. The workshop concluded with some final remarks by Dr. Elisabeth Eide. Dr. Jonathan S. Addleton, Rector, FCCU, was also present at the occasion and gave his concluding speech.

After that, certificates were distributed among the participants. Overall, the training was informative and valuable for participants and encouraged them to become changemakers within their institutions and support the efforts to introduce climate journalism education courses for journalism students in Pakistan.

4. Science Journalism Workshop

was held at FCCU on Wednesday. Prof Dr Shahid Munir, Chairperson of Punjab Higher Education Commission (PHEC) was the Chief Guest on the occasion. 








Sudoku Challenge - 23rd January 2023

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








Dr. Safi Kaskas



Dr. Nisar Ahmed's academic year brought along numerous remarkable feats comprising on:


Dr. Nisar through the Research and Development Forum arranged webinars an in person seminars on topics circling around religion, ethics and morality.


Dr. Keneth Parvaiz (Assistant Professor Department of Religious Studies)






