lation Research Center (PRC), "Empowerment and Intimate Partner Violence in married women of reproductive age: Evidence from Pakistan Demographic Health Survey 2017-2018" was submitted to Journal of Interpersonal Violence in June 2020 and was accepted for publication in November 2020. The Journal of Interpersonal Violence is a peer-reviewed academic journal that focuses on the study of victims and perpetrators of interpersonal violence. It is published by SAGE publications and had an impact factor of 3.064 in 2019. The study was an attempt to identify demographic, household, women empowerment factors that predicted emotional, physical, and sexual violence in ever-married women of reproductive age (15-49 years, n = 3,965) inPakistan by performing secondary analysis on Pakistan Demographic and Health Survey, 2017-2018. The analysis was done using SPSS (v.22)

The first publication by Popu- and binary and multivariate logistic regression techniques were performed for analyses. The analysis found that 30.2% of women experienced emotional, 24.1% reported less severe physical, 6.5% experienced severe physical, and 4.3% experienced sexual violence, respectively. The multivariate analysis found that husband's age, education, wealth, and alcohol consumption were significant predictors of intimate partner violence (IPV). Additionally, womens' age, education, and number of children also significantly predicted IPV. With respect to empowerment variables, ownership of house was a significant predictor of less severe physical violence, ownership of property significantly predicted emotional violence, and autonomy in household.

> PRC's second publication titled "Institutional environment of old age homes and its relation to adjustment of older adults: Evidence from Pakistan" was submitted to Journal of Aging and Environment in

September 2020 and was accepted for publication in November 2020. Journal of Aging and Environment (formerly known as Journal of Housing for the Elderly) is a peer-reviewed academic journal that focuses on theoretical and empirical research in environmental gerontology. It is published by Taylor & Francis Inc. and had an impact factor of 1.15 in 2018. This study was conducted on a sample of 270 residents, living in old age facilities across Punjab. Results suggested that institutional environment along with number of children and number of visitors was a significant predictor of adjustment of older adults. Interventions such as higher support from staff and residents, autonomy, and engagement can help older adults to adjust better in old age homes.

Research Repository

Research Proposal

In late October, PRC submitted it's proposal for research funding titled "Assessing the impact of illiteracy, physical and psychological health, and psychosocial characteristics on the cognitive development of underage brick layers in Pakistan" to "Spencer Foundation"

The research study will analyze the impact of illiteracy, physical and psychosocial health on child brick workers' cognitive development in Punjab, Pakistan. Research in this area is important as child-workers are deprived of formal education and often endure hazardous and stressful conditions at the workplace. The study has potential to identify which cognitive skills are well developed in school going children as compared to out of school children and vice versa. The study will help identify interventions for improving illiterate child workers' lives and future prospects.

Panel Discussion on "Demography and its role in understanding the COVID-19 crisis"

PRC organized an online panel discussion titled "Demography and its role in understanding the COVID-19 crisis" on November 24, 2020 from 4 pm to 6 pm in collaboration with Population Council (PC) Pakistan, United Nations Population Fund (UNFPA) and the Center for Learning and Teaching (CLT) at Forman Christian College (A Chartered University). The Co-Chairs for the panel discussion were Dr. Jonathan S. Addleton (Rector, FCCU) and Dr. Zeba Sathar (Senior Associate & Country Director, PC). The panel comprised of following experts from different countries: Dr. Leiwen Jiang, Senior Associate (PC, New York) and Professor and founding Director of Asian Demographic Research Institute, Shanghai University; Dr. Feng Oiushi, Associate Professor at National University of Singapore, Singapore; Dr. L.J.G. (Leo) van Wissen, Director and Professor, Netherlands Interdisciplinary Demographic Institute, University of Groningen, Netherlands; Dr. Gavin W. Jones, Emeritus Professor in School of Demography, Australian National University, Australia; Dr. Ghulam Mohammad Arif, Former Joint Director, Pakistan Institute of Development Economics, Pakistan. The event was attended by FCCU's senior administration, faculty, and staff, and representatives from various national and international organizations also attended the panel discussion.

The event started with the welcoming of Co-Chairs, Panelists, and Participants by Director PRC. Mr. Shuja Waqar (Lecturer, Economics) and Mr. Daud Rafique (Research Assistant, PRC) recited Holy Quran and Holy Bible.

Dr. Addleton in his welcome note felicitated
