In these three months, we have focused on analyzing on our financial situation seriously by reviewing this fiscal year (July 2025-June 2026) and preparing a budget of next fiscal year (July 2026-June 2027). Then, we have confirmed through the two meetings of Finance Committee (June 15) and Executive Committee (June 19) that TSA/FCCU needs to raise more funds domestically and internationally because of impact on us from recent wars (America, Israel and Iran).

Therefore, we kindly ask you not only to pray for these 3 matters below, but to advise us and connect us with relevant persons or organizations

- (1) developing a better quality system on operational level at TSA,
- (2) capacity building with quality staff on how to generate revenues from within TSA/FCCU, and
- (3) relevant connections to raise funds internationally with careful consideration, against increasing dependency on foreign funding.

Our dear Brother Peter and Sister Lea-Jen as a couple have resigned on the 21st June 2026. We all really appreciate their contributions to TSA/FCCU for the last two years.

Brother Peter as Manager of PC (Physiotherapy Center) has improved quality services of staff of PC by training them with new techniques and he has also equipped PC with new tools and inventories for clients.

Sister Lea-Jen has improved a better financial system in more transparent and systematic ways by analyzing all the data of all projects of TSA with such accuracy and diligence and made more usable report format in Auditing and Budgeting with great help of MT (Management Team) of TSA and Finance Team of FCCU.

As they move on into their next journey, they will be missed, and we all are praying for God's special Blessings and guidance on their future.

More importantly, CTCRC (Christian Trauma Care and Research Center) of TSA has provided 24 LED TVs to 24 Burnt churches in Jaranwala in June, so that Pastors and Sunday School Teachers of each affected church would help their Christian Children to know love and care of Jesus more by learning the Bible stories, Christian Songs and seeing Dramas through a LED TV as an educational tool and they may be healed and restored from their Trauma and sense of despair into healing and restoration with hope.

We are so thankful to those who have prayed for Children of 24 Churches in Jaranwala and donated their funds to purchase the 24 LED TVs for them.

Update 16

April - June 2026

Staff Training Workshop

- Ms. Ghazala Malik (Principal TSA Special Education School) attended a **3-day training workshop** was organized by the Government of Punjab, **Social Welfare Training Institution**, Township, Lahore, from 19th to 21st May 2026. The workshop focused on Capacity Building Training on Cycle Management.



Ongoing Therapy and Assessments

- One-on-one sessions continued for new students, alongside regular speech therapy, physiotherapy, psychological assessments, and family counseling. Comprehensive speech assessments were also conducted to guide individualized support plans.

Needle Crafts Center (NCC)

- Photographs of NCC products along with their prices were uploaded on TSA's official website as a step to move towards e-commerce in future.
- Communication with FCCU Campus Store management is ongoing to set up a display. This will help bring our products and the talent of underprivileged women to more customers, including the FCCU community.

Physiotherapy Center (PC)

- During April to June PC continued to serve its purpose by providing treatment services to 241 outdoor patients and to the students of Special Education School.

Christian Trauma Care & Research Center (CTCRC)

Care Team Training at Murree

- During the first week of June, CTCRC hosted its 3rd Sharing and Learning Session at the Retreat and Renewal Centre in Murree. TSA staff and Care Team Members from All Saints Church, Peshawar, participated in the session.
- Dr. Matthew shared a devotional on our identity in Christ and ministering to those in trauma. Dr. Seo facilitated sessions on team building and conflict resolution.



Sunday School Teachers' Training

- During the second week of June, pastors and Sunday School teachers from Jaranwala attended a training program at Murree. The sessions equipped them with interactive teaching methods, including storytelling, action songs, and creative classroom engagement.
- Facilitators demonstrated how Smart LED TVs and digital resources can enhance Sunday School lessons. Participants left with renewed enthusiasm and practical tools for their ministry.



TV Distribution to Jaranwala Churches

- In a significant outreach effort, 16 large-screen (65-inch) LED TVs were distributed to 16 churches, and 8 (43-inch) LED TVs were provided to 8 additional churches in Jaranwala. These TVs are specifically designated to enhance Sunday School programs for children.
- The distribution was met with immense joy and gratitude from the church communities.



PSTSS Attendance at GCTS 2026

From 22nd to 24th April, representatives from PSTSS (Pakistan Society for Traumatic Stress Studies) attended the 2026 GCTS (Global Collaboration on Trauma and Stress) in Seoul, South Korea.

Dr. Amjad (President of PSTSS) and Mrs. Abeeha (Secretary of PSTSS) were introduced to the National Trauma Center (NTC) during the visit. This connection opened new avenues for collaboration and learning in trauma care.

Update 16

April - June 2026

Translation of Trauma Healing Booklet

The Urdu translation of the booklet titled "Healing the Wounds of Trauma" has been completed. This translation will make the resource more accessible to Urdu-speaking communities in Pakistan.

Hostel

- From April to June, 90 girls stayed in TSA/FCCU Hostel with 12 students in the small hostel building and 78 in the main hostel building.
- Food & beverages department held an orientation for Spring 2026.
- Moreover, orientation about TSA/FCCU Hostel and its operations was given to Summer 2026 Out Reach program Students.

Forman Psychological Services Center (FPSC)

Workshop on Systematic Review and Meta-Analysis

- On 22nd April, FPSC organized a 3-hour workshop on Systematic Review and Meta-Analysis. The session was conducted by Mr. Usman Arshad, Assistant Director of Evidence Synthesis at the Pakistan Institute of Living and Learning.
- Participants learned essential steps, including developing research questions, searching literature, selecting studies, and synthesizing evidence.

Webinar on E-Cigarette Prevention

- On 21st May, FPSC hosted a webinar on "Recent Trend of Use of Electronic Cigarettes and Vaping in Pakistan and Its Prevention." The session was conducted by Dr. Noor-Ul-Zaman Rafiq, Director of Research Administration & Engagement at PILL.
- The webinar highlighted the increasing prevalence of e-cigarette use among youth and discussed associated health risks. Prevention strategies and policy measures were also emphasized.

Skill Bridge Series

- On 4th June, Ms. Syeda Kanza Fatima, Clinical Psychologist at FPSC, conducted a session on "Understanding Lived Experiences through Interpretative Phenomenological Analysis (IPA)." The session was organized for ICMS - IVY College of Management Sciences.
- Participants gained practical understanding of exploring lived experiences within psychological inquiry.

Client Consultation

Throughout this quarter, clinicians delivered a total of 20 sessions to clients visiting FPSC. Continued therapeutic support was provided to address the psychological well-being of individuals in need.

Management Report

- Application for Financial Assistance for financial year 2026-2027 was submitted to **Punjab Welfare Trust for the Disabled**.
- On 15th June, the **Finance Committee meeting** was held in Seminar Room of Admin Building, TSA/FCCU. During the meeting, the annual budget for FY2026-27 was thoroughly reviewed and approved by the Finance Secretary. Additionally, it was decided to revise the SOPs of TSA finance and accounting system in light of the MIP software implemented at TSA.
- On 19th May, the **Executive Committee** was held in Seminar Room of Admin Building, TSA/FCCU. The Annual Budget for FY2026-27 was presented and unanimously approved by all members of the committee, with the decision that TSA should actively explore and implement diverse **fundraising** strategies and opportunities to generate additional revenue and bridge its budget deficit.
